The Regional Centre for Research and Training in Municipal Administration was set up by the Union Ministry of Health, Family Planning Works, Housing and Urban Development in January 1968 for conducting research and providing in-service training to municipal officers of the States of Uttar Pradesh, Bihar and Madhya Pradesh. The Centre has now completed four years of its working and the present report relates to the activities for the year 1971-72.

Training Programme

The normal quota of three training courses could not be completed during the year as the newly constructed hostel for the trainees, within the University campus, was not ready till September 1971. Then, September floods further delayed the training programme.

The first course of the year and 10th in the series was started on October 26, 1971 and concluded on December 4, 1971. The course was inaugurated by Sri Dharam Dutt Vaid, Minister of Local Self-Government, Uttar Pradesh and the concluding function was presided over by Sri B. N. Pandey, Ex-Mayor, Allahabad. It was attended by 10 municipal officers from Uttar Pradesh and Bihar.

The second course of the year and 11th in the series was inaugurated on January 10, 1972 by Sri K. K. Dass, Secretary to the Government of India, Ministry of Health and Family Planning. The closing function was presided over by Sri K. C. Joshi, Mukhya Nagar Adhikari, Agra, on February 19, 1972. It was attended by 13 municipal officers from the States of Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh. The names of the municipal officers who attended the above two training courses are given in Appendix I.

Conferences

A Conference on the Reforms in Municipal Government was organised on December 3 and 4, 1971 at the conclusion of the 10th in-service training course. It was inaugurated by Dean, Dr. P. N. Masaldan of Lucknow University. The Conference was attended both by officials and non-officials apart from the trainees of the 10th in-service training course. The names of the participants of this Conference apart from the trainees of the 10th course, are given in Appendix II.

The Conference on "Statutory Agencies for Urban Development" proposed to be held on February 18 and 19, 1972 had to be postponed due to the annual meeting of the U. P. Nagarpalika Adhyaksha Sangh.

Evaluation of the Training Programme

So for, eleven training courses, three each in the year 1968-69, 1969-70 and 1970-71 and two in the year 1971 72 have been organised. In all 228 municipal officers have participated in these courses. More than 3/4th, i. e. 172 of these officers came from urban local bodies of Uttar Pradesh. The following table shows the total number of officers belonging to different categories in Uttar Pradesh as also the number of trainees who have received the training against the total strength:—

The above table shows that only 10.5 per cent of the municipal officers of the centralised cadre in U. P. have been trained so far. During this period, the emphasis was laid on Administrative Services with the result that more than 1/4th of them have attended the training courses. About 22.3 per cent of the Education Superintendents and 18.9 per cent officials belonging to Audit and Accounts Services also attended the training programmes. No officer belonging to Medical and Arboriculture Services has attended the training programme so far.

The number of participants from the participating States in the two courses, during the year 1971-72 is shown in the following table:

It would be seen from the above table that nearly 87 per cent of the trainees in the above two courses came from Uttar Pradesh alone. The participation from the other two States was poor. The number of trainees attending each course also decreased very considerably. The reason for this short-fall was late nomination of the trainees and also a lack of incentive. The overall number also decreased as the third training programme of the year could not be held due to national emergency. The attention of the Advisory Committee is particularly drawn towards decreasing number of trainees to various courses. Special efforts are needed to augment the training programme by the Chairman and the Secretaries of the States.

Attachments

During the Tenth Training Course all the trainees went to Bhopal and Indore. The officers of the Eleventh Training Course went to Delhi.

During the attachment period the trainee-officers studied the working of Municipal Corporations and allied agencies and submitted reports individually. In Delhi, they particularly saw the work being done by the Delhi Development Authority. It has been felt that (i) the period of attachment should be increased; (ii) it should be outside the 'region'; and (iii) the groups should be smaller.

Lecture-Discussions

The names of the Guest Speakers who addressed the trainees in the two courses are given in Appendix III.

Syndicate Reports

The trainees were divided into groups and allotted topics for preparing syndicate reports based on their study, experience, mutual discussions etc. The topics assigned for writing syndicate reports during the two course were:—

Tenth Course : . Unauthorised Construction.

Eleventh Course : 1. Administration of Food Adulteration Act.

2. Assessment and Collection of Property Tax.

Case Studies

The trainees were required to prepare a few case study reports based on their personal experience with the help of model case studies supplied to them.

Review of Acts and Statutes

The participants of the Tenth and Eleventh Courses were divided in batches for reviewing the Municipal Acts, Statutes, Manuals and Bye-laws of the three States.

Research

Last year the Centre was assigned the study of 'Integrated Services to Youth and Children in Urban Areas' by the Indian Institute of Public Administration. A detailed family, clinical and dietary survey of the project area was carried out during the period under report and preliminary findings of the survey were submitted to the UNICEF. It is heartening to note that proposal for Lucknow City is one of the three finalised in the country.

The research report on Centralisation of Municipal Services was finalised during the year 1971-72.

During the year under report a study on 'Under-assessment of Property Tax in Lucknow City' was assigned by the Union Ministry of Health and Family Planning. The field work is in progress and it is expected that the final report will be ready by the end of June 1972.

The work on the study relating to the working of Municipal Boards in Uttar Pradesh is in progress and it is expected that the report will be finalised during the year 1972-73.

The following two publications were brought out during the year under report:—

- Problems of Management and Financing of Water Supply in Urban Areas (Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh and Bihar).
- 2. Working of Municipal Corporations in Uttar Pradesh.

Diploma in Urban Government and Administration

The course is becoming popular. Twenty students were admitted to this course during the academic session 1971-72.

Library

With a view to meet the growing requirements of trainee officers and research workers in the field of local government, urban planning and allied fields a separate section containing books, pamphlets and reports on the above subjects has been created. This section has been strengthened considerably by grants from the Government of India and the Government of Uttar Pradesh. The library has also started indexing of microliterature.

Hostel

As originally planned, the construction of the trainees' hostelcum-guest house has been completed within the campus. It has 33 rooms with attached bath rooms and 5 guest suites for the trainee officers and guest speakers respectively.

The September floods of 1971 had damaged the construction work to some extent which required extra expenditure. The State Government were pleased to sanction an additional amount of Rs. 90,000/- for this purpose vide G. O. No. 815/-(2)-5 G/69 dated March 25, 1972 during the financial year 1971-72.

Renovation of the Centre's Building

As already given in the Annual Report of 1970-71 the State Government had sanctioned a sum of Rs. 1,10,000/- during the year to renovate the existing building of the Centre. The detailed estimates finally scrutinised and approved by the State Town and Country Planning Organization showed that this will ultimately require a sum of Rs. 1,70,000/-. The Government of Uttar Pradesh has been pleased to release this additional amount vide G. O. No. 815/11-(2)-5 G/69, dated March 25, 1972.

Contributions

As reported earlier a sum of Rs. 31,090/- was received as contribution from the local bodies of the State of Uttar Pradesh in response to G. O. No. 274-A/11-Ka-G/68, dated February 27, 1969. Further contributions to this amount during the year were as follows:—

Grant by the Government of Madhya Pradesh

Apart from the above contributions by the local bodies, a recurring grant of Rs. 5,000/- has been sanctioned by the Government of Madhya Pradesh vide G O. No. 17391/88/Nagar/1 dated August 28, 1971. This gesture is gratefully acknowledged. The Government of Bihar has also taken a decision to sanction a non-recurring grant during the year 1972-73, the details of which are still awaited.

Programme for the Year 1972-73

The Advisory Committee in its meeting held on March 8, 1972 approved the programme of the Centre for the year 1972-73 as given below:—

- I. Four In-service Training Programmes in Municipal Administration according to the following schedule each of one month's duration:—
 - (a) First Programme :- April 1972 to May 1972.
 - (b) Second Programme: July 1972 to August 1972.
 - (c) Third Programme :—September 1972 to October 1972.
 - (d) Fourth Programme:—November 1972 to December 1972,
- Three Conferences and Seminars (subject to be decided in consultation with the Chairman and other participating States.
- It is proposed to hold one short-term specialised course for Municipal Officers.
- IV. It is proposed to hold two Orientation Courses for nonofficials of fifteen days' duration each.
- V. The Centre has collected a number of case studies from the Trainee Officers. A number of cases are being selected for further study by the Staff of the Centre. As this Project involves going through

the official records and files, the State Governments will be requested to issue necessary orders to the local bodies to make the records etc. available to the Centre's Staff.

VI. After completing the research projects in hand, it is proposed to take projects relating to some areas of Urban Development and Planning, in consultation with the Chairman.

The Budget of the Centre

The Advisory Committee in its meeting held on October 19, 1970 approved the budget of the Centre as given in Appendix IV.

Audit

The Accounts of the Centre for the financial year 1970-71 were audited by Messrs. A. Shah & Co., Chartered Accountants, Lucknow, as per Appendix V and submitted to the Ministry of Health, Family Planning, Works, Housing and Urban Development, Government of India, New Delhi.
