The fifth annual report of the activities of the Regional Centre for Research & Training in Municipal Administration set up by the Ministry of Health, Family Planning, Government of India, relates to the period 1972-73. The Centre has completed five years of its existence.

#### Director

Dr. R. B. Das, Professor & Head, Department of Public Administration continued as its Director and Member-Secretary of the Advisory Committee.

#### Chairman, Advisory Committee

Sri M. U. Ahmad, Commissioner cum-Secretary to the Government of Uttar Pradesh, Department of Local Self-Government became the Chairman of the Advisory Committee from August 1972 after the transfer of Sri S. N. Verma as Mukhya Nagar Adhikari, Agra, Uttar Pradesh.

Dr. P. N. Masaldan, Dean, Faculty of Arts and a member of the Advisory Committee joined Jodhpur University, Rajasthan, as Vice-Chancellor. In his place Prof. Baljit Singh, Head of the Department of Economics and the new Dean, became the new member. Sri S. M. Mushfique, Mukhya Nagar Adhikari, Lucknow Municipal Corporation was succeeded by Sri S. K. Chowdhury.

#### Training Programmes

During the year under review, three training courses were organised.

The first course of the year and 12th in the series was inaugurated by Sri S. N. Verma, Secretary to the Government of Uttar Pradesh, Department of Local Self-Government on April 26, 1972. Its closing function on May 24th, 1972 was presided over by Sri T. P. Tewari, Secretary to Government of Uttar Pradesh, Department of Planning. The Course was attended by ten municipal officers.

The second training course of the year and 13th in the series was inaugurated on September 27, 1972 by Sri K. K. Dass, Secretary to Government of India, Ministry of Health, Family Planning & Urban Development. The closing function held on November 2, 1972 was presided over by Sri Raja Ram Singh, Minister for Local Self-Government, Madhya Pradesh. The course was attended by 20 newly recruited municipal officers of Uttar Pradesh and two nominees of Orissa Government.

The third training course and 14th in the series was inaugurated by Sri Beni Singh Awasthi, Minister for Local Self-Government, Uttar Pradesh on December 14, 19 2. The valedictory address was delivered by Dr. Gopal Tripathi, Vice-Chancellor, Lucknow University on January 19, 1973. The Course was attended by nine municipal officers. Two officers from Nepal were deputed by the Government of India to receive practical training in the working of Local Government Institutions in the State.

The names of the municipal officers of the above three training courses are given in Appendix T.

#### Orientation Courses for the Non-Officials

The Centre organised a two-weeks' Orientation Course for elected representatives of the municipal boards of Uttar Pradesh. The Course was inaugurated by Sri Beni Singh Awasthi, Minister for Local Self-Government, Uttar Pradesh on August 21, 1972. Its closing function was presided over by Sri Jagdish Saran Agarwal, Chairman, Uttar Pradesh Housing and Development Board on September 2, 1972. It was attended by ten elected representatives. The names of the participants are given in Appendix 'II'.

#### Conference

At the end of the fourteenth training course, a two-days' Conference on "Statutory Agencies for Urban Development" was organised. The Conference was inaugurated by Sri Beni Singh Awasthi, Minister for Local Self-Government, Government of Uttar Pradesh on January 21, 1973.

The Conference was attended by officials and non-officials apart from the trainees of the fourteenth training course. The names of the participants of the Conference are given in Appendix 'III'.

#### Training Programme: An Evaluation

During the short period of its existence, the Centre organised fourteen In-service Training Courses and one Orientation Course for the elected representatives of the Urban Local Bodies. In all 260 municipal officers from the participating states have been trained in these courses. Considering that more than 1600 personnel of centralised services are working in Uttar Pradesh alone, only 217 have been trained. The matter received active consideration by the Advisory Committee in its meeting on December 8, 1972. It was decided that the respective Governments may be requested to send more trainees to the courses so that the existing training facilities may be fully utilised. It was also resolved by the Committee that 'Training' should be treated as an additional qualification at the time of promotion to different posts.

These courses have been attended by the personnel of Administrative Engineering, Education, Health, Audit and Accounts Services.

The participants of the 12th Training Programme studied the working of Calcutta Metropolitan Development Authority and Calcutta Metropolitan Planning Organisation. During the 13th Training Course, the participants were attached to (1) Delhi Development Authority, (2) New Delhi Municipal Committee; and (3) Delhi Municipal Corporation. The officers of the 14th Training Programme saw the working of the Bombay Municipal Corporation and All India Institute of Local Self-Government. All the participants of the three courses submitted their reports individually.

#### Syndicate Reports

The trainees were required to prepare syndicate reports based on their study, mutual discussion etc. The topics assigned for writing syndicate reports during these courses were—

2. Municipal Elections

#### Case Studies

The trainee officers submitted a few case study reports based on their personal experience with the help of model case studies supplied to them.

#### Review of Acts and Statutes

The participants of all the above three courses were divided in batches for reviewing the municipal acts, statutes, manuals and bye-laws of the three states.

#### Research

During the period under review the following research reports were submitted to the UNICEF:—

- 1. Report on the Socio-Economic Survey;
- Report on Household Food Consumption and Nutrition Survey;
- 3. Report on Vocational Training and Guidance; and
- 4. Report on the Educational Survey.

The Research Report on "Assessment of Property Taxes in Lucknow" has been submitted to the Union Ministry of Health and Family Planning.

#### Diploma in Urban Government and Administration

The course is proving useful and has been set up with a view to provide necessary pre-service training to such candidates as desire to enter local government service.

#### Library

To cater to the growing requirements of trainee officers and research workers in the field of local government, urban planning and allied areas, a separate section containing books, pamphlets and reports on the above subjects has been created. This section has been strengthened considerably by grants from the Central Government and also from Government of Uttar Pradesh. The Library has also started indexing of micro-literature.

#### Buildings

The construction work of the Trainees' Hostel-cum-Guest House and Renovation of the existing building of the Centre has almost been completed.

#### Contribution

The Centre has received contributions from the local bodies of the State of Uttar Pradesh. By the end of the financial year 1971-72, a total sum of Rs. 34,341/- had been received. During the period 1972-73, a sum of Rs. 100/- was received from the municipal board, Mangalore, Saharanpur. These contributions are gratefully acknowledged.

# Grant from the Government of Madhya Pradesh

The Government of Madhya Pradesh has sanctioned a recurring grant of Rs. 5,000/- this year also vide G. O. No. 933/18/1/73, dated 21-2-73. This is gratefully acknowledged.

### Grant from the Government of Uttar Pradesh

The Uttar Pradesh Government has been pleased to sanction some staff for the Trainees' Hostel-cum-Guest House and a recurring grant for its maintenance. A recurring grant of Rs. 20,000/- for inviting visiting Professors, expenditure on researches and for miscellaneous contingencies has also been provided. Further a non-recurring grant of Rs. 50,000/- for completing the construction of Centre's building and purchases of furniture and other equipments has been sanctioned. The details of the above grants sanctioned under G.O. No. 311/11-2-5G/72 dated March 29, 1973 are given in Appendix 'IV'. This gesture is gratefully acknowledged.

#### Budget

The Advisory Committee in its meeting held on March 8, 1972 approved the budget of the Centre as given in Appendix 'V'.

#### Audit

The Centre has been receiving grants from -

- 1. Government of India
- 2. Government of Uttar Pradesh
- 3. Government of Madhya Pradesh.

The accounts of the Government of India grant for the year 1971-72 could not be audited due to non-appointment of a Chartered Accountant by the University authorities. The university authorities insisted that since the Government of India laid down in their conditions that grant of the Centre will be audited by university auditors—the appointment of Chartered Accountant was irregular. Accordingly, the Government of India was approached to relax this condition. It has been relaxed but the university authorities have not yet decided to appoint a Chartered Accountant.

The Special Audit of the grants received from the Government of Uttar Pradesh has been completed and the final report is still awaited. It will be placed before the Advisory Committee in due course.

#### Important Decisions

- A post of an Accountant was created by the Advisory Committee on March 8, 1972 and it was decided that the incumbent be taken from the Government on deputation.
- A provision for the purchase of an Ambassador Car was made out of the contributions received from the local bodies of the State.
- The deputation period of the Municipal Officer on deputation was restricted to three years only. The Government has, however, extended the period of deputation upto March 31, 1973.
- 4. The inclusion of non-officials of municipal boards/corporations as member of the Advisory Committee was made on the recommendation of the Government of India vide their letter No. 11020/10/72-LSG dated June 2, 1972. The Government of Bihar and Madhya Pradesh have been requested to nominate one member each for a period of two years.
- The staff members of the Centre have been allowed to go to Urban Local Bodies in the Region for observation tours to gain firsthand knowledge about their working
- 6. The Director was authorised with the concurrence of the Dean, Faculty of Arts to declare visitors to the Centre in connection with its various activities as "Centre's Guests". They will be accorded free boarding, lodging and transport facilities.
