From the Chief Editor's Desk



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प्रिय पाठको,

भारतवर्ष के स्थानीय स्वायत्तशासन के विकास की दिशा में एक महत्वपूर्ण कदम 74वें संविधान संशोधन द्वारा उठाया गया। इसके द्वारा स्थानीय निकायों को विकेन्द्रीकरण के पूर्ण प्रशासनिक एवं वित्तीय अधिकार प्रदान किये गये। परिणामस्वरूप, इस दृष्टिकोण से अनेक अधिनियम पारित किये गये तािक स्थानीय निकायों के लोकताित्रक स्वरूप तथा उनके अधिकारों और कार्यों का और अधिक विस्तार सम्भव हो सके। कार्यों की सूची के अवलोकन से यह स्पष्ट होता है कि नगरीय स्थानीय निकायों का कार्य नगरीय सुविधायें उपलब्ध कराने के परम्परागत कार्यों तक ही सीिमत नहीं है, अपितु संविधान ने इन निकायों की गरीबी उन्मूलन, आर्थिक नियोजन तथा सामाजिक विकास में भी सिक्रय भूमिका निर्धारित की है।

बढ़ते हुए नगरीकरण के कारण जो मुख्य चुनौतियां सामने आयी हैं, उनमें मिलन बस्तियों की बढ़ती हुई जनसंख्या, मकानों की अत्यधिक कमी, पीने हेतु स्वच्छ पानी की आपूर्ति में कमी, पर्यावरणीय खतरे जैसे— हवा, जल तथा ध्विन प्रदूषण, कूड़ा—करकट, भूमि पर दबाव, अवैध कब्जे, अव्यवस्थित नगरीय वृद्धि आदि प्रमुख हैं। हमें इन चुनौतियों का डटकर तथा युक्तिपूर्ण ढंग से सामना करना होगा।

इसी परिप्रेक्ष्य में मा॰प्रधानमंत्री, डा॰मनमोहन सिंह ने 3 दिसम्बर, 2005 को 'जवाहर लाल नेहरू नेशनल अरबन रिन्यूवल मिशन' के नाम से एक अत्यंत महत्वाकांक्षी योजना देश को समर्पित की, जिसमें उत्तर प्रदेश के 6 नगर निगमों (लखनऊ, कानपुर, आगरा, इलाहाबाद, वाराणसी एवं मेरठ) तथा एक नगर पालिका परिषद् (मथुरा) को चयनित किया गया है। इस योजना के द्वारा स्थानीय निकायों को तीव्र गित से बढ़ती हुई जनसंख्या को, विशेष रूप से बड़े शहरों में मूलभूत नागरिक सुविधायें जैसे— सुरक्षित पेयजल की आपूर्ति, सफाई, नाली, जल—कल निस्तारण, मार्ग प्रकाश, सड़कें, परिवहन व्यवस्था आदि की सुचारू व्यवस्था का उत्तरदायित्व सौंपा गया है। इस उद्देश्य को पूरा करने के लिए नगरीय स्थानीय निकायों को अपने संसाधनों के आधार को विस्तृत एवं सघन बनाना होगा। साथ ही अपनी संस्थागत क्षमताओं को सुदृढ़ करना होगा तथा उनकी अधिकार सम्पन्नता को सुनिश्चित करना होगा।

उत्तर प्रदेश सरकार द्वारा इस दिशा में सकारात्मक कदम उठाये जा चुके हैं एवं रीजनल सेंटर भी जे०एन०एन०यू०आर०एम०हेतु 'स्टेट रिसोर्स सेन्टर' एंव सॉलिड वेस्ट मैनेजमैंट के लिए 'नोडल एजेन्सी' के रूप में अपनी भूमिका से सफलतापूर्वक योजना के कुंशल प्रबंधन द्वारा सक्रिय योगदान कर रहा है।



Academic Activities (January to March, 2006)

Orientation Workshops
 JNNURM, UIDSSMT
 & IHSDP

Venue : Lucknow

Dates: January 18, 19 and 20, 2006

In fulfillment of the desire of the State Government of Uttar Pradesh, the Regional Centre oriented the Executive Officers of all the towns having a population of more than 50,000 on the Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM), Urban Infrastructure Development Scheme for Small & Medium Towns (UIDSSMT) and Integrated Housing and Slum Development Programme (IHSDP).

These one-day Orientation Workshops were organised on January 18, January 19 and on January 20, 2006 on JNNURM, UIDSSMT IHSDP with the following main objectives:

- to highlight the main provisions of JNNURM, UIDSSMT and IHSDP
- to emphasize on the need of developing small and medium towns
 - to discuss the importance, need and techniques for preparing CDPs and DPRs
- to identify the areas for PPP in the provision of urban services etc.

The programmes were attended by Municipal Commissioners/Additional Municipal Commissioners of all the Nagar Nigams and Executive Officers of all the Nagar Palika Parishads having population of 50,000 or above. About 62 officers each attended on 18th January and on 19th January and 48 on 20th January 2006. In all, 172 officers were oriented.

The faculty for these programmes was drawn from the core faculty of the Centre and representatives of State Government, SUDA and Directorate of Urban Local Bodies who also enriched the deliberations. The guest faculty included Sri S.P. Singh, Special Secretary, Urban Development, U.P.; Sri Diwakar Tripathi, Director, SUDA and Smt. Alka Srivastava, Director of Urban Local Bodies U.P.

जवाहर लाल नेहरू नेशनल अर्बन रिन्यूवल मिशन (जे.एन.एन.यू.आर.एम.), अर्बन इन्फ्रास्ट्रक्चर डेवलपमेंट स्कीम फार स्माल एण्ड मीडियम टाउंस (यू.आई.डी.एस.एस.एम.टी.) तथा इन्टीग्रेटेड हाउसिंग एण्ड स्लम डेवलपमेंट प्रोग्राम (आई. एच.एस.डी.पी.) योजनाओं की जानकारी उत्तर प्रदेश के उन नगरीय निकायों जिनकी जनसंख्या 50,000 से अधिक है, के अधिकारियों को दी गई। यह तीन कार्यशालायें उत्तर प्रदेश सरकार की इच्छानुसार आयोजित की गई।

यह कार्यशालायें क्रमशः जनवरी 18, 19, एवं 20, 2006 को तीनों योजनाओं को आच्छादित करते हुए आयोजित की गईं। कार्यशालाओं के मुख्य उद्देश्य निम्नवत् थे:

- जे.एन.एन.यू.आर.एम., यू.आई.डी.एस.एस.एम.टी. एवं आई.एच.एस.डी.पी. योजनाओं के मुख्य तथ्यों से अवगत करवाना
- छोटे एवं मझोले कस्बों के विकास की आवश्यकता पर प्रकाश डालना
- सिटी डेवलपमैंट प्लान (सी.डी.पी.) एवं डिटेल्ड प्रोजेक्ट रिपोर्ट (डी.पी.आर.) को तैयार करने की तकनीकों पर विचार—विमर्श करना, तथा
- नगरीय सेवाओं को प्रदान करने में सार्वजनिक—निजी भागीदारी के क्षेत्रों को चिन्हित करना।

कार्यशाला में नगर निगमों के नगर आयुक्त, अपर नगर आयुक्त एवं नगर पालिका परिषदों के अधिशासी अधिकारियों ने भाग लिया। कुल 172 अधिकारियों ने कार्यशालाओं में प्रतिभागिता दर्ज करायी, जिसमें जनवरी 18 तथा 19 को प्रत्येक दिन 62 अधिकारियों ने भाग लिया, जबिक जनवरी, 20 2006 को 48 अधिकारियों ने भाग लिया।

उपरोक्त कार्यक्रम हेतु सेन्टर की कोर फैकल्टी के अतिरिक्त राज्य सरकार, सूडा एवं स्थानीय निकाय निदेशालय के प्रतिनिधियों ने भी अपना वक्तव्य दिया। अतिथि वक्ताओं में प्रमुखतः श्री एस०पी० सिंह, विशेष सचिव, नगर विकास, उत्तर प्रदेश शासन, श्री दिवाकर त्रिपाठी, निदेशक सूडा एवं श्रीमती अलका श्रीवास्तव, निदेशक, स्थानीय निकाय, उत्तर प्रदेश सम्मिलित थे। All these Workshops were coordinated by Dr. U.B. Singh, Joint Director in active association with Dr. Rajeev Narayan, Deputy Director.

Training Programme 'Planning for Healthy City'

Various countries. including India, have formulated policies and programmes to deal with environmental and health-related problems, since they have been witnessing population concentration and growth due to migration from rural areas, Keeping the above issues in mind, the Regional Centre for Urban and Environmental Studies, Lucknow organised a three days' training programme on Planning for Healthy City, the first of its kind, from January 23-25, 2006 for the municipal officials of the State of Uttar Pradesh.

The main objectives of the training programme were

- to sensitize the officials towards integrated health, sanitation and urban waste management in cities and the proper handling of bio-medical wastes and
- to discuss the various aspects of urban environment management, and control of communicable diseases.

There was a Panel Discussion on "Planning for Healthy City: Some Important Issues and Suggestions" in which the participants interacted with the expert panelists. The Panel Discussion was jointly presided by Sri S.A.T. Rizvi, senior bureaucrat and Chairman, IIIrd State Finance Commission, Government of Uttar Pradesh and Sri S.P. Singh, Special Secretary, Urban Development Department, U.P.

The programme was attended by 20 senior officers, who included Assistant Municipal Commissioners of Nagar Nigams and Executive Officers of various Nagar Palika Parishads of Uttar Pradesh.

All the participants were enthusiastic about learning the various issues relating to general health of the citizens, especially the details of management of hospital waste and communicable diseases. They even suggested that study tours should be conducted to foreign countries and other states within the country.

The training programme was coordinated and directed by Dr. Richa Varmani, Joint Director and Dr. Anjuli Mishra, Deputy Director who was the Co-Course Director.

अन्य देशों की भाँति, भारतवर्ष में भी बढ़ती जनसंख्या तथा पर्यावरण एवं स्वास्थ्य सम्बन्धी समस्याओं से निपटने के लिए विभिन्न नीतियों एवं कार्यक्रम चलाये जा रहे हैं क्योंकि ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों से निरन्तर नागरिकों का पलायन हो रहा है। उपरोक्त तथ्यों को दृष्टिगत रखते हुए रीजनल सेंटर, लखनऊ ने उत्तर प्रदेश राज्य के म्युनिसिपल अधिकारियों हेतु एक त्रि—दिवसीय प्रशिक्षण कार्यक्रम 'प्लानिंग फार हेल्दी सिटी' विषय पर दिनांक जनवरी 23 से 25, 2006 आयोजित किया।

कार्यक्रम के मुख्य उद्देश्य निम्नवत थे :--

- शहरों में स्वास्थ्य, सफाई एवं नगरीय कूड़ा प्रबन्धन एवं बायोमेडिकल वेस्ट की उचित व्यवस्था के बारे में प्रतिभागियों को अवगत कराना तथा
- नगरीय पर्यावरण प्रबन्धन एवं संक्रामक रोगों पर नियंत्रण हेतु विभिन्न पहलुओं पर चर्चा करना।

कार्यक्रम के दौरान एक पैनल परिचर्चा 'स्वस्थ शहर का नियोजन : कुछ महत्वपूर्ण तथ्य एवं सुझाव' विषय पर आयोजित की गई, जिसमें प्रतिभागियों ने विशेषज्ञों के साथ विचार—विमर्श किया। परिचर्चा की अध्यक्षता श्री एस.ए.टी.रिजवी, अध्यक्ष, तृतीय राज्य वित्त आयोग, उत्तर प्रदेश शासन एवं श्री एस०पी०सिंह, विशेष सचिव, नगर विकास विभाग, उत्तर प्रदेश के द्वारा संयुक्त रूप से की गई।

WorkshopsSolid Waste Management

Management of Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) resulting from rapid urbanization has become a serious concern for all because of poor resources and inadequacies of the existing systems. The issue of solid waste management has been given significant importance in both the newly launched schemes of JNNURM and UIDSSMT. The Twelfth Finance Commission has also given priority to solid waste management and has recommended spending of minimum 50% finance for solid waste management in class I towns. Hence, the Regional Centre organized two Workshops on this important issue.

The specific objectives were to familiarize the participants with the concept and principles of solid waste management and its environmental impact on land; methods of its disposal; to discuss the waste management options and best practices as well as the issues relating to preparation of DPRs in SWM.

The Workshops were based on lecture-cumdiscussions. Enough time was devoted to discussion and problem solving. There was also a Panel Discussion on 'Solid Waste Management'.

The participants of the first Workshop were Municipal Commissioners, Additional Municipal Commissioners, Nagar Swasthya Adhikaris and Engineers from Nagar Nigams, government officials from the Department of Urban Development and representatives of NGOs working in urban development and solid waste management. In all, there were about 40 participants in the Workshop.

The participants of the second workshop were a Executive Officials from the department of Urban Development, and local bodies and representatives of NGOs working in solid waste management. There were about 30 participants in all.

The external faculty consisted of Shri. S.P. Singh Special Secretary, Urban Development, U.P.; Smt. Alka Srivastava, Director, Local Bodies; Shri Kedar Nath, Additional Director, Local Bodies, and Shri Anand Prakash, Environmental Engineer.

Shri S.P. Singh, Special Secretary, Urban Development, U.P. acquainted the participants with the commitment of the government towards solid waste management. Dr. U.B. Singh, Joint Director also delivered lectures.

The Workshops were directed by Dr. Rajeev Narayan, Deputy Director.

बढ़ते हुए नगरीकरण के परिणामस्वरूप पालिका ठोस कूड़े का प्रबन्धन, वित्तीय स्रोतों में कमी एवं वर्तमान दोषपूर्ण नीतियों के कारण एक गम्भीर समस्या का रूप लेता जा रहा है। अतः पर्यावरण, प्रदूषण एवं स्वास्थ्य संबंधी खतरों को रोकने के लिए नगरीय कूड़े के उचित प्रबंधन की अत्यंत आवश्यकता है। नयी केन्द्रीय योजनायें, यथा जे. एन. एन. यू.आर.एम. एवं यू.आई.डी. एस.एस.एम.टी. में भी ठोस कूड़े प्रबन्धन पर भी पर्याप्त महत्व दिया गया है। बारहवें वित्त आयोग ने ठोस कूड़े प्रबन्धन को प्राथमिकता देते हुए संस्तुति की है कि प्रथम श्रेणी के नगरों में कम से कम 50 प्रतिशत धन इस कार्य हेतु व्यय किया जायेगा। रीजनल सेंटर ने भी इसके महत्व को दृष्टिगत करते हुए इस विषय पर दो कार्यशालाओं का आयोजन किया।

कार्यशालाओं का विशेष उद्देश्य प्रतिभागियों को ठोस कूड़ा प्रबन्धन की धारणा एवं सिद्धांतों से परिचित करवाना एवं भूमि पर पर्यावरणीय प्रभाव, निस्तारण के उपाय, कूड़ा प्रबन्धन के अन्य एवं सर्वोत्तम कार्यो से परिचित करवाना थे। ठोस कूड़ा प्रबन्धन के विस्तृत प्रोजेक्ट रिपोर्ट (डी.पी.आर.) तैयार करने के तरीकों पर भी विचार किया गया।

कार्यशाला व्याख्यान एवं परिचर्चा पर आधारित थी। अधिकतर समय विचार—विमर्श एवं समस्याओं के निराकरण में व्यतीत किया गया। कार्यशाला के दौरान 'ठोस कूड़ा प्रबन्धन' पर एक पैनल परिचर्चा का भी आयोजन किया गया।

Report Card system was introduced in the State of U.P. on a pilot basis under the UNDP assisted project on 'Capacity Development for Urban Governance.' This system is now to become a regular feature and the performance of the service providers would be ranked on this basis. Hence the Centre organized two Workshops of one-day duration each on February 8 and 10, 2006 to familiarize the Municipal Officers with the report card system.

The objectives of the programes were to familiarize the participants with the concept of report card system, to discuss the need and importance as well as the planning strategy, process and method of the report card system. The questionnaire preapared for the report card system was also discussed.

The Workshops were lecture-cum-discussion based Detailed presentations were made on various aspects of report card system and enough time was devoted to discussion and problem solving. There was also a Panel Discussion on 'Report Card System'.

The participants of the Workshops were Executive Officers of Class-I towns, government officials from Department of Urban Development and representatives of NGOs working in urban development and solid waste management. In all there were 28 participants.

Shri S.P.Singh, Special Secretary, Urban Development, U.P. urged the officials to change their mind set, in order to improve their working and to encourage citizen's participation. Dr. U.B. Singh, Joint Director also delivered lectures.

रिपोर्ट कार्ड सिस्टम पहली बार उत्तर प्रदेश में यू०एन०डी०पी० सहायतित परियोजना 'नगरीय प्रशासन हेतु क्षमता विकास' के अंतर्गत प्रस्तावित की गई थी। वर्तमान में सेवा प्रदाय संस्थाओं के मध्य उनकी कार्य क्षमता को श्रेणीपद करने हेतु यह एक निरन्तर चलने वाली योजना बन गई है। क्षेत्रीय नगर एवं पर्यावरण अध्ययन केन्द्र, लखनऊ द्वारा उपरोक्त विषय पर दिनांक फरवरी, 8 तथा 10, 2006 को म्युनिसिपल अधिकारियों को रिपोर्ट कार्ड सिस्टम से अवगत कराने हेतु दो कार्यशालाओं का आयोजन किया गया।

Special Activity Under Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission

The Regional Centre has been designated by the Government of Uttar Pradesh as the *State Resource Centre* for the Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM) which is the largest ever initiative taken by the Government of India in the urban sector.

The two Sub-Missions envisaged under the JNNURM focus on 'Urban Infrastructure and Governance' and 'Basic Services for the Urban Poor' respectively, The Mission with a budgetary provision for of Rs. 50,000 crore for a period of seven years, shall provide grant assisstance to the 63 cities initially identified for the specified activities.

All the above mentioned major and other related miscellaneous activities were carried out by Prof. K. Sreeram, Consultant who was assisted by Dr.Urmila Bagga, Joint Director.

'जवाहर लाल नेहरू नेशनल अर्बन रिन्यूवल मिशन' (जे.एन.एन.यू.आर.एम.) हेतु क्षेत्रीय नगर एवं पर्यावरण अध्ययन केन्द्र, लखनऊ को उ०प्र०शासन द्वारा स्टेट रिसोर्स सेन्टर घोषित किया गया है। यह मिशन भारत सरकार द्वारा नगरीय क्षेत्र में अभी तक किया गया सबसे महत्वपूर्ण कदम है।






