Social Audit of Urban Development Projects

PATNA

Social audit is a tool through which government departments can plan, manage and measure non-financial activities and monitor both internal and external consequences of the departments social and commercial operations. Social audit gives an understanding of the administrative system from the perspective of the vast majority of the people in the society for whom the very institutional/administrative system is being promoted and legitimized. Social audit of administration means understanding the administrative system and its internal dynamics from the angle of what they mean for the vast majority of the people, who are not essentially a part of the state or its machinery or the ruling class of the day, for whom they are meant to work.

Social audit is an innovative mechanism which can create the enabling conditions for public accountability. However, without an aware and demanding civil society, it would be difficult to make social audit work at the field level.

Hence a one day training programme on "Social Audit

of Urban Development Projects" was organized by the Regional Centre for Urban and Environmental Studies (RCUES), Lucknow for the senior municipal officials of Bihar on January 18, 2014 at Patna.

The programme was attended by thirty six senior officers of Department of Urban Development & Housing, Nagar Nigams and Nagar Palika Parishads of Bihar.

The course was directed by Dr. Anjuli Mishra, Joint Director with the support of Dr. Nasruddin, Assistant Director, RCUES.

Double Entry Accounting System in Urban Administration Process

LUCKNOW

The mounting pressure for public accountability has highlighted the need for reforms at the government accounting and records keeping level. With the changing role of Urban Local Bodies the urgent need is felt for change in the accounting & financial reporting principals & formats. Most of the urban local bodies in India are presently following cash based single entry system of accounting. Under this basis of accounting, transactions are recorded when the related cash receipts or cash payments take place, a statement of assets and liabilities may or may not be prepared. The cash based accounting has its demerits as it fails to meet most of the financial reporting objectives. The limitations of cash based accounting for proper measurement of performance and financial health of the ULBs has led to the adoption of accrual basis of accounting. Further it would also help the ULBs to access the financial market for resources required for development. The conversion from cash based single entry system of accounting to accrual based double entry system of accounting has also been made mandatory reform by Govt. of India under JNNURM. In view of the above the State Governments have initiated the accounting reform in ULBs of the State.

Keeping in view the importance of the above mentioned subject a one day Training Programme was organized by the Regional Centre, at Lucknow on 5th March 2014.

The main objects of the programme were:

- ♦ To familiarize the participants with the need & importance of Double Entry Accounting System.
- ◆ To acquaint the participants with the provisions of the National DEAS manual and Fixed Asset Valuation Manual
- To acquaint the participants with the basic DEAS principals & procedures.

The participants of the training programme consisted of Municipal Officials of Uttar Pradesh. In all 12 participants participated in the programme.

Municipal Resources Mobilization & Financial Management

Deputy Director, Directorate of Local Bodies, Govt. of U.P. along with faculty of RCUES addressing the participants during the training programme Local governments in India suffer from fiscal imbalances due to challenges in raising requisite funds to meet their mandated functions. Even though urban local governments should be able to raise revenues to fund public services, at this time, they neither have adequate revenue assignments nor a sufficiently large tax base to generate required revenues. They are, therefore, mostly dependent on intergovernmental transfers from higher levels of government to meet their expenses.

Keeping in view the importance of the above subject, the Regional Centre for Urban & Environmental Studies, Lucknow organized a one day training programme on Municipal Resource Mobilization & Financial Management in Urban Local Bodies on March 7, 2014 at Lucknow. The objective of the training programme was to sensitize the officials of Urban Local Bodies towards need for mobilization of municipal resources and to discuss on ways and means of enhancing municipal revenue.

The participants included Executive Officers, Tax Officers and accountants from Nagar Palika Parishads and Nagar Panchayats of Uttar Pradesh. In all 11 participants participated in the programme. The programme was coordinated by Dr Alka Singh, Deputy Director, RCUES, Lucknow.

National Urban Livelihood Mission

The Ministry of Housing and Urban Poverty Alleviation Government of India launched National Urban Livelihoods Mission to reduce poverty and vulnerability of the urban poor households by enabling them to access gainful self employment and skilled wage employment opportunities, resulting in an appreciable improvement in their livelihoods on a sustainable basis, through building strong grassroots level institutions of the poor. The mission aims at providing shelters equipped with essential services to the urban homeless in a phased manner. In addition, the mission would also address livelihood concerns of the urban street vendors by facilitating access to suitable spaces, institutional credit, social security and skills to the urban street vendors for

accessing emerging market opportunities.

As National Resource Centre under Ministry of Housing & Urban Poverty Alleviation, Government of India, the Centre conducted several capacity building programmes under NULM. The key objectives of the workshop were to sensitize & orient the participants and provide a platform for meeting, interaction and mutual experience sharing for various State/City/ Field level officials concerned with implementation of NULM including bankers in the respective states. Rajiv Awas Yojana

In pursuance of the vision of Slum Free India, Ministry of Housing & Urban Poverty Alleviation, Government of India, launched Rajiv Awas Yojana to provide housing facilities to slum dwellers in June, 2011. The flagship scheme is in two phases – first the preparatory phase that existed for a period of two years and ended in June, 2013; second the implementation phase for a period of 2013-2022. The schemes aims to achieve vision of Slum Free City by encouraging States/Union Territories to tackle the problem of slums in a definitive manner by a multi-pronged approach focusing on bringing all existing slums within the formal system and enabling them to avail the basic amenities and tackling the shortages of urban land and housing. In view of the growing importance of Training and capacity building of Stakeholders for effective implementation of the scheme, the Ministry Housing & Urban Poverty Alleviation, Government of India has entrusted the task of orientation and training of concerned officials and people's representatives of Urban Local governments in 10 states including North Eastern region.
